



Use

- We use **present simple questions** to ask about people's lives and things they do every day, week, etc.

- **'Do you study after school every day?'**

- **'Yes, I do.'**

- **'Where do you study?'**

- **'In my bedroom.'**



- We also use **present simple questions** to ask about how someone thinks or feels about something, or about facts.

- **'Does it rain a lot in your country?'**

- **'Yes, it does.'**

- **'What do you think of this photo?'**

- **'I love it!'**

Form

- We form **present simple yes / no questions** with:

Do / Does + subject + verb?

yes / no questions			
Do / Does	subject	verb	
Do	I you we they	play	computer games after school?
Does	he / she / it		

Tip

In present simple questions, we don't add -s to the verb for *he / she / it*:

Does she like pizza? (NOT ~~Does she likes pizza?~~)



- We usually answer *yes / no* questions with a short answer.

Short answers					
Positive (+)			Negative (-)		
Yes,	I you we they	do.	No,	I you we they	don't.
	he / she / it	does.		he / she / it	doesn't.

Tip

In short answers we don't use the main verb:

'Do you speak Japanese?' 'Yes, I do.' (NOT *Yes, I speak.*)

- We form **present simple *wh-* questions** with:
Question word + *do / does* + subject + verb?

Wh- questions				
Question word	<i>do / does</i>	subject	verb	
Where	do	I you we they	live?	
How	does	he / she / it	get	to school?

- We use different question words to ask about different types of information.

What (for things and activities)

- *'What do you do after school?' - 'I watch TV or listen to music.'*

Who (for people)

- *'Who do you know in the class?' - 'Anna and Kate.'*

When / What time (for times)

- *'What time does the concert start?' - 'At 7 p.m.'*

Where (for places)

- *'Where does he live?' - 'In New York.'*

How (for the way people do things)

- *'How do you get to school?' - 'I walk.'*

Why (for reasons)

- *'Why do they like football?' - 'Because it's exciting!'*
