Will there be food for everyone in the future? In the year 1800 the world's population was about one billion. In 1950 there were about two and a half billion people, and by 2008 there were nearly seven billion. 134 million babies are born each year, and some predict that nearly a third of those born today will live to be 100. Scientists think that by 2040 there will be nine billion people on the planet. The population will grow fastest in Latin America, Asia, and especially Africa, but it will go down in Europe.

A lot of experts are worried, because they think there won't be sufficient food in the future, and that wealthier countries will become mean and aggressive when protecting their resources. But a few scientists are more positive. They think that people will have greater intelligence and knowledge in the future, and we will learn practical ways to grow more food.
