Awkward Auditions

You have finally got an audition to get a part in the play of your dreams. What could go wrong? Well, almost anything! We spoke to two actors who shared with us their most awkward audition moments so you can learn from their mistakes.

Jack, 25 – I remember auditioning for a Shakespeare play, *Hamlet*. I had studied *Hamlet* at school, so I wasn't worried about the script, but I was concerned about getting the accent right, so I spent hours perfecting my English accent, listening to actors reading Shakespeare in sophisticated ways. When I started the audition, I said the first line, "To be or not to be ..." and then my mind went blank. I couldn't remember the words. I should've invested more time in memorizing the text. Years later, I discovered that the original Shakespeare actors used a mix of local accents, so I had actually wasted my time trying to sound upper class! Since then, I memorize a script without fail and only use accents when instructed by the theater company.

Mary, 27 – My audition consisted of a four-page scene and a song. I spent hours learning my lines, and I felt reasonably confident about the song. At the audition, my dialogue went pretty much as expected, but I put so much effort into it that I must have strained my voice. I didn't have any water with me and when I launched into my song, my mouth went dry - I just couldn't reach the higher notes! I sounded like a sick cat. It was horrible. Sadly, the audition ended there. I wanted to crawl under a rock! I ought to have done some light vocal exercises to warm up my voice beforehand. It's a lesson you only learn once!
