Five Children and It (1902)

The house was three miles from the station, but, after five minutes, the children began to put their heads out of the window and say, 'Aren't we nearly there?' And every time they passed a house, which was not very often, they all said, 'Oh, is this it?' But it was when they got to the top of the hill that they saw a white house with a green garden and an **orchard**, and mother said, 'Here we are!'

'How white the house is,' said Robert.

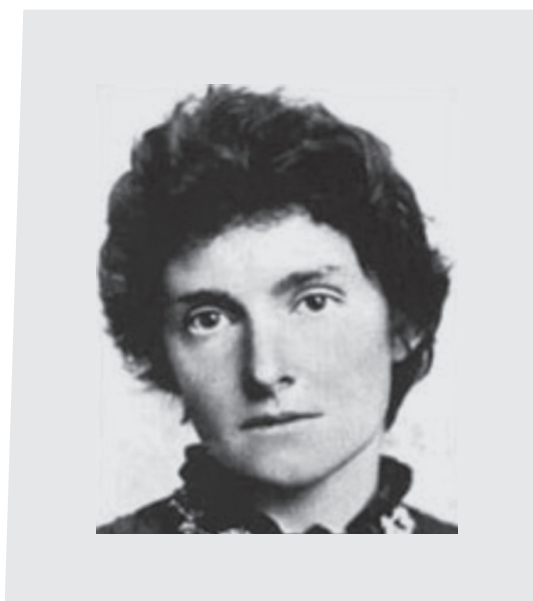
'Look at the lovely **roses**,' said Anthea.

'And the **plums**,' said Jane.

'It's nice,' agreed Cyril.

It was not really a pretty house; it was quite ordinary. But the house was in the countryside, and the children had been in London for two years, without going to the **seaside** even for a day.

Of course, London has shops and theatres, and **entertainments** and things, but if your family is poor you don't go to the theatres, and you can't buy things out of the shops; and London has none of those nice things that children may play with – such as trees and sand and woods and waters.



The best was that here there were no **regulations** about not going to places and not doing things. In London almost everything said 'Don't touch'. The children explored the gardens and they saw they were certain to be happy at the White House. They thought so from the first moment, but when they found the back of the house they had no **doubts** at all ...

orchard	a piece of land where fruit trees are grown
roses	flowers with a nice smell
plums	soft, round fruits
seaside	an area or town next to the sea
entertainments	things people enjoy like films, shows or television
regulations	rules (instructions about what you must and must not do)
doubts	feelings of not being sure about something
