### 'Missing: Page Thirteen' from *The Golden Slipper, and Other Problems for Violet Strange* (1915) Anna Katherine Green

No one could say, or, at least, no one there tried to, but everybody started to look for it.

- 15 But where to look? The small room had nowhere to **hide** a square of white paper. It had **bare** walls, a bare floor, and a single chair for furniture. Perhaps someone in the room had it. Could this be the answer?

'Is Mr Spielhagen sure that the missing page was with the others when he sat down to read his papers?' asked Miss Digby.

'Very sure, I was reading the formula itself when I fell asleep.'

<b>discovery</b>	when something new, or lost, is found
<b>formula</b>	a plan for a way to do something
<b>promised</b>	said that you will certainly do something or that something will certainly happen
<b>copies</b>	things that are made to look exactly like something else
<b>doubt</b>	the feeling of not being certain about something
<b>hide</b>	put something in a place where it cannot be seen or found
<b>bare</b>	not covered by anything
<b>searched</b>	tried to find someone or something
