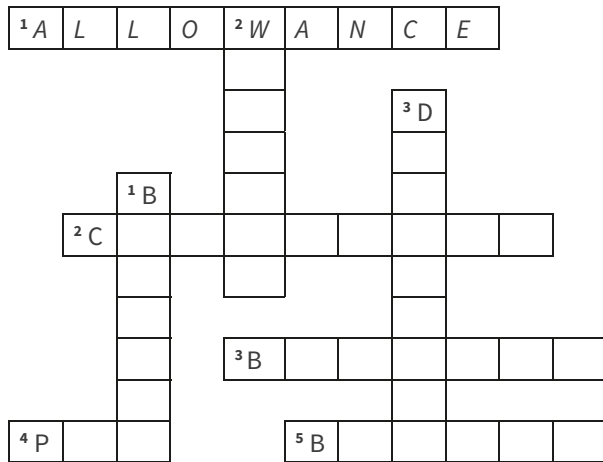


1 Use the clues to complete the crossword. You have the first letter.

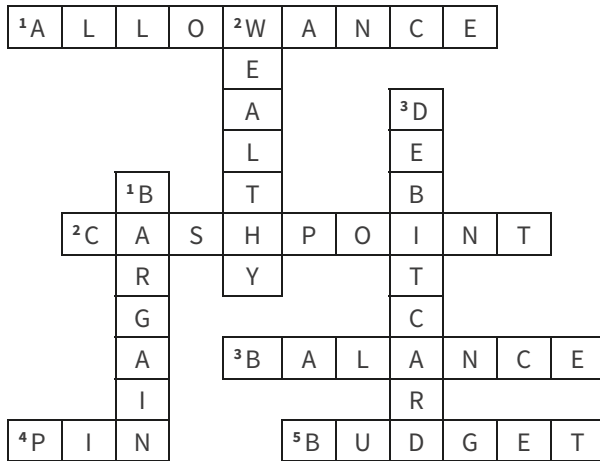
