The Adventures of Dillon Helbig

After eight-year-old Dillon Helbig wrote a book, he wanted other people to read it. So, on a visit to his local library in Boise, Idaho, US with his grandmother, he quietly put it on a shelf and left it there. He didn't tell his grandmother or the library staff. When the eight-year-old returned some time later, the book was no longer there.

The 80-page-book tells the story of Dillon and his journey to different places in time. He wrote it in four days during the winter holidays and included pictures that he drew himself.

When Dillon told his mum about the book, she called the library. She was worried about the staff throwing it away, but she didn't need to worry. The staff had the book and they loved it. They wanted to keep it for other people to read.

Now, there is a waiting list of 56 people who want to read the story. The library staff are talking about making a copy for people to read online, too.

Dillon is already writing his second book. It's about a cupboard which eats people's jackets. He got the idea for this from school. In this book, he wants to include his dog, Rusty.

Dillon isn't the only eight-year-old to write his own book. Milan Kumar from Bolton, UK wrote a book after he finished a reading challenge. He wanted to read 50 books in a year. He actually read them in three months. The books weren't all children's books. For example, he read a book about Nelson Mandela before a trip to South Africa.

Milan's book tells the story of a young boy who helps people to feel positive in difficult times. The money he gets from the book is going to the National Literacy Trust – so far that's £3,000. The Trust helps all young people to read well. Milan loves reading and wants all children to enjoy books.
