The History of Money

1 ____

Money wasn't always the metal coins and paper notes we know today. People used all kinds of interesting things to buy products from people. First, they used the products themselves. 'I give you my bread and you give me your apples'. Then, they began to use other valuable objects. The first of these objects was around 11,000 years ago. People used cows, sheep and goats to pay for the things they needed.

Shells were also very popular in places where people could get them easily from the sea. The first we hear about them is in China around 3,300 years ago. Shells were also a form of money in other parts of Asia, Africa, Europe and countries in the Pacific Ocean. Heavy shells were usually more valuable than lighter ones.

3 ____

People began to use coins around 2,700 years ago in a place called Lydia which is now Turkey. The coins were made of metal and they were important because people could travel to buy products. It's not easy to take a cow with you on a long journey to buy things you need! For some people, salt was very valuable because it wasn't easy to get, so they used this to buy things. People made coins from salt, too.

Cheese was another food item that people used as money. In Italy, people used parmesan cheese as money. They also gave their cheese to the bank so they could borrow money. The bank knew they could keep the cheese and not lose money. Even today, there is one Italian bank which lends money for cheese. It has around 430,000 wheels of parmesan cheese with a value of over €100m.

1,300 years ago, people in China started to make notes from paper. Three hundred years later, Sweden became the first European country to make these kinds of notes. Paper notes were lighter to carry around, but they were also easier to copy. That's why many notes today are made using a kind of thin plastic.
