Getting around

There are many ways get around this city. It depends on what you want to **see and do. Some areas of the city are easier to get to than others.**

For example, it's best to take the subway to get to the centre. It's faster **than the bus but it's more expensive. Subway trains usually come** every five minutes. They start at 6.00 a.m. and finish at midnight. The city **centre is popular with tourists because it has a lot of restaurants and** cafés. Tourists can get special subway tickets with a 20 percent discount.

The business area of the city is in the west. There are many offices.

People usually travel by train. These trains are busier in the morning.

In the south of the city, there is a beautiful park which people like to go to **at weekends. Unfortunately, you can't get there by train or subway, but** there is a bus.

If you want to watch sport, there's a stadium. There are several ways to get there. Most people like taking the tram because it's quicker than **the bus and cheaper than a taxi. It only takes 30 minutes.**

The city doesn't have an airport, but there is a ferry you can take across **the river. It's better to take the ferry than drive because there's only** one bridge, so there's often a lot of traffic.
