How to make a career in acting

A lot of people dream of becoming a famous actor. Maybe you think you **haven't got what it takes, but don't let that put you off. In this article,** we're going to give you some tips on how to make a career in acting.

A

Firstly, you need to know what's happening in the acting world. If you don't **get out and meet people, you won't know what's going on. If you're** living in a big city, there are usually plenty of theatrical productions, as well **as TV and film opportunities. However, if you live in a smaller town,** don't panic! There might be less happening, but it might be easier to get a **part in a local production. Subscribe to local arts journals and** websites so you don't miss out on opportunities where you live.

B

Related to the previous point, we'd recommend creating a strong social **media presence for yourself. It's probably the most effective way to get** yourself known in the acting world. Have you ever noticed how even A-list **celebrities are never off it? It might take time to build up followers, but** try to stay positive. Upload video clips of yourself acting out your favourite **scenes to give your followers a taste of your skills.**

C

Nobody ever said acting was easy and even the greatest actors put in a lot **of work to stay at the top. You need to carry on developing your skills** if you want to have an advantage over the competition. One way is to enrol **on an acting course at a local college, but you can also pick things up** in more informal situations. Workshops are a great way to find out about **different acting techniques and you can also look out for online ones.**

You should also reflect on whether you've got any other talents that might **help you get on in your acting career. Don't forget about the other** things you're good at as the most successful actors are often the ones who **can sing and dance as well – just think about Ryan Gosling in 'La La Land'**. So, if you know how to dance a tango or juggle five balls, make sure **you keep practising because it might help get you a role one day.**

Finally, unless you've already been offered a life-changing role, acting **probably won't be enough to pay the bills. We've all heard the stories** about actors working three jobs just to pay the rent. However, it doesn't have **to be that bad. Just try to find a job which is enjoyable and not too** tiring, so that you've got plenty of energy for acting at the end of your shift. **And if you can find an employer who's flexible about when you work,** it will help when it comes to organising auditions.
