Languages in New Zealand

New Zealand is a small country in the Pacific. The population is 4.9 million. It has two islands: North Island and South Island.

In New Zealand, most people speak English, but about 200,000 speak Māori, and about 25,000 speak New Zealand Sign Language.

The language of the first people in New Zealand is Te Reo Māori. In the nineteenth century, many English speakers arrived, and people spoke English at work and at school, and in their free time. Before the 1940s, you could only hear Māori in villages. Then, in the 1970s, more people used Māori, and in 1987, it became an official language.

Māori people keep their culture. They put their noses together when they say hello, and they have special dances and songs. They also cook delicious food – chicken and fish – and they often cook outside, not in a kitchen.

In New Zealand, you can find a green stone in rivers. This green stone is very important to Māori people. Today you can buy it, and it is a very good present for your friends or family!
