How to stay friends after an argument

Even the best relationships are never easy. Whether it's your best friend, a mate or a classmate, there are always times when arguments happen. But it's important to repair the damage after arguments if you want to continue being friends. Here is some advice on how to do exactly that. Firstly, it's important to take time to become calm again. When you and your best friend are arguing, things can get worse quickly. When this happens, the only way to stop the argument is to walk away and breath slowly.

Before you speak to your mate again, think about what you both said when you got angry. Remember that a fight always involves two people. So take the time to think about how your friend felt about what you said at the time. Consider other things happening in your life, for example have you felt stressed out about something recently? It's not an excuse, but telling your friend about your own problem might help them understand you better, too. Also, if they had those problems, you'd want to help them.

Plan carefully how to speak to them. But don't leave it too long (no more than a few days); otherwise, it will be more difficult. Wait until you feel ready to say sorry and start with something like, 'I really miss spending time with you outside school.' If your friend is not ready to speak to you, then wait until they are. If you try to make things better with them again and they're not ready, you might just make it worse. If they are, then really listen to what they say and try to understand. Once they've finished, you can do something nice for them, like give them a present or plan an activity with them, to make them feel better. Finally, don't share any details with other people, either in person or on social media. If you did that, it would make things much worse.
